

YSS Main Program Components



- Individual Counseling, Assistance, and Referral
- Reconnecting Youth Classes
- Club Live/Friday Night Live Leadership
- School-Wide Prevention Campaigns
- SUPER (Substance Use Prevention Education Resource)

Individual Assistance & Counseling Services

More than 700 unique students have benefitted from more than 3000 individual counseling services.

(59% female, 71% Latino, 24% Anglo)

Students self-refer 31% of the time

Services include individual assistance, therapeutic counseling, client advocacy, crisis intervention, and restorative mediations.



Reconnecting Youth (RY)

192 students participated in daily RY classes.

RY is an Evidence-Based Program

Main Goal Areas of RY:

- Drug and Alcohol Control
- Mood Management
- Academic Achievement

Curriculum Units:

- Self-Esteem
- Decision-Making
- Personal Control
- Interpersonal Communication

Reconnecting Youth

"Reconnecting Youth is my second family. It makes me feel confident knowing I have someone to support me. I'm accepted. I'm worth it. I have a life to live."

"RY should be at every school because as a teenager we make bad decisions and RY is a safe place to change for the better."

Club Live/Friday Night Live Leadership

Over 150 teens experienced <u>meaningful</u> <u>participation with caring adult role</u> <u>models</u> in club meetings and leadership meetings.

Over 100 club meetings and activities provided <u>safe</u>, <u>healthy</u>, <u>and supportive</u> <u>opportunities</u>.

Students <u>developed leadership skills</u> by leading trainings and campaigns





Opportunities for Engagement



YSS and student leaders engage thousands of students through school wide campaigns.





Outcomes for FNL/CL

- 95% of participants reported that being involved in the program helped them feel more excited about and committed to school.
- 86% of participants reported having "strong" opportunities for community involvement
- 95% of participants stated that they being involved in the program helps them decide to do other things than ATOD

S.U.P.E.R.

Substance Use Prevention Education Resource



- YSS facilitate this 4 session evening series which brings parents and teens together to develop positive family relationships, improve communication, and address substance use issues.
- The series focuses on increasing parental involvement with their children, building teen self-esteem, and improving family communication skills. They also include discussions about the legal, psychological, and physical aspects of substance abuse.
- YSS have offered 12 SUPER series for 96 families
