Community Service

The MAD community service trip is the most anticipated and life changing activities for the students and parents each year. On January 18-22, 2014 the MAD Academy community will engage in "Five Days of Service;" significantly expanding the scope and reach of our service efforts. Students will have the option of serving locally in one of several pre-arranged projects or traveling to Valle Redondo, Mexico to build homes for families in need. Five Days of Service with both local and global opportunities will extend our outreach, increase student participation, and still meet the purpose and vision for the trip. This vision is comprised of four major goals:

- 1. Provide students with an opportunity to make an immediate, meaningful and visible impact in the lives of others (empowerment),
- 2. Get students out of their comfort zone to experience life as others may live (empathy)
- 3. Provide cross-cultural interaction and appreciation (global citizens)
- 4. Build community in MAD across and within grade levels (team building)

Adding local opportunities will increase the number of students able to participate by including those who may have conflicts preventing them from leaving town for five days. Returning to Mexico will reduce travel time and cost while improving cross cultural interaction and empowerment. The evolution of this experience will also address the concern voiced by some former students that doing the same thing every year "got old."

Some individuals have asked why we are returning to Mexico rather than Arizona. One reason is that it will result in significant cost savings. Utilizing parent drivers, rather than busses, to transport students to and from Mexico will cost significantly less and the materials used to build the homes in Mexico result in additional cost savings. A second reason Mexico is more appealing is the overall experience. The buildings are constructed of wood, stucco, concrete slabs and composite shingle roofing. These materials allow the students to complete or nearly complete a house in three days which provides a sense of accomplishment not experienced in Arizona. The materials are also more rewarding to work than Styrofoam and wire mesh. And, equally important, the Mexican families are far more open and communicative than the Apache which provides a significantly richer cultural exchange for the students.

Safety is a concern in every trip we take. Valle Redondo and its surrounding communities in Mexico where we worked previously and would return to this year have continued to have an excellent safety record (better than all big U.S. cities). In the past five years over 56,000 students and adults have worked in the Valle Redondo vicinity with Amor (the group that organizes our trips) without incident. Amor takes every precaution to ensure the safety of its groups including escorting the groups to and from the border, to and from the work sites daily, working with the police, fire and local government and providing 24 hour security at the base camp. For our local community service opportunities we will need to be just as vigilant to ensure the safety of our students.

Five Days of Service engages our students in looking beyond themselves and fulfills individual growth objectives that are not addressed in other aspects of the MAD Academy. The addition of local service opportunities will increase student involvement and impact more lives. It is also a replicable model that has the potential to engage our greater community and bring recognition to the MAD Academy. Thank you for supporting the life changing impact that this experience will have on our students and others.

MAD Home Building (Jan 18-22)

MAD students, contractors and volunteers will transform the lives of several families by building them homes in the communities surrounding Valle Redondo, Mexico. Over the course of three days students will pour a concrete foundation, frame, stucco and roof a small house. Students will experience empowerment by making a meaningful difference in the lives of others. Students will also gain empathy for those they are serving by experiencing life without electricity, running water and permanent shelter. The cross cultural interaction will foster appreciation for our global community and, working as a team will strengthen the MAD Academy community.
