III. Description of Proposed Course.

 - A. Title of course: Service Learning
 - B. Length of course (semester, year long): Year long, and outside of the regular school day (Monday and Wednesday evenings). We would like it to be a variable unit course (between 1-5 units of credit) so that a wide range of students can participate and earn credit for the Service Learning projects that they undertake. Some Business Teams inherently require a bigger time commitment than others, which can overburden students. A variable unit structure will foster a greater feeling of equity and encourage students to give what they can rather than giving too much at the expense of other commitments. A variable unit structure will also create a sense of equity, inclusivity, and accessibility to all volunteer and service learning opportunities. We want all DPEA students to be able to participate in Service Learning projects without having the commit to a 5 unit course. The units they earn will depend completely on the Service Learning work that they do.

D. Description of the standards taught in the course.

The DPEA Service Learning class will offer training in skills essential to running the Engineering Academy and participating/serving on one of our Business Teams, including:

- Business Communication skills such as presentations and grant writing
- Journalism skills
- Financial skills such as accounting and purchasing
- Graphic skills such as design and web content
- Media skills such as photography, video, and editing
- Organizational and time management skills
- -Project development and implementation skills
- -Human resources management skills

The course will also give students the opportunity to serve the DPEA, DPHS, and larger community in a variety of ways: through community service projects, outreach efforts including tutoring and student support efforts at local schools, a range of social events, etc. Students will develop ideas and work in groups to bring these ideas to fruition. They will plan their projects and harness the human resources and other resources necessary to execute/implement their visions. All projects undertaken will have a service component to them.

There are a variety of ways that DPEA students can serve the DPEA, DPHS, and the larger community, and creating a variable unit structure will encourage students on the Business Teams to volunteer for other Service Learning opportunities (such as helping teachers inventory materials, landscape around the building, and support the peer tutoring program, etc). All of these types of service are vital to the sustainability of the DPEA. Furthermore, if a core group of DPEA Service Learning students lead/facilitate and participate in such activities, this can motivate other DPEA students to volunteer and work alongside them, creating a greater sense of community and giving students the opportunity to develop and implement a wide range of Service Learning projects.

A DPEA teacher will lead the class, with additional support offered by volunteer mentors with specialized expertise.

 Since 2008, seniors in the Dos Pueblos Engineering Academy have participated in Business Teams that run the program like a small business. The teams have adult mentors who are volunteers from the community. There are currently over 20 business teams that cover all aspects of the DPEA: http://www.dpengineering.org/dpeabusiness-teams

As the DPEA grows to its enrollment of 400+ students, there is a need to include underclassmen in the business teams and to formalize the organization of the business teams. This process can begin with a Service Learning class through the DPEA where students will receive instruction and applied experience with a variety of skills. This class will be a platform for offering a broader leadership model for the Engineering Academy.
