RESOLUTION REGARDING SUFFICIENCY OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS
(Education Code Section 60119)

WHEREAS, Education Code section 60119 mandates that the governing board of every school district hold a public hearing to determine whether there are sufficient textbooks or instructional materials available to each district pupil; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Santa Barbara Unified School District, in order to comply with the requirements of *Education Code* Section 60119 held a public hearing on September 11, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. which did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Santa Barbara Unified School District, provided at least ten days notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the district that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Santa Barbara Unified School District, encouraged participation by parents, teachers, bargaining unit leaders, and members of the community, in the public hearing, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, for year-round elementary schools (Cleveland School and the Santa Barbara Community Academy), and;

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in the following subjects: Reading/Language Arts/English Language Development, Mathematics, History-Social Science, and Science, and;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that for the 2012-2013 school year, the Santa Barbara Unified School District has provided each pupil at year-round schools (Cleveland School and the Santa Barbara Community Academy) with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.
