Ms. Carey and Dr. Ramirez presented this item. Ms. Carey explained that the District has been partnering with Consulting Firm, InnovateEd for a couple of years. They have determined that they are making great strides in terms of their systems leadership and improving systemic thinking around increases in student outcomes. She went on to say that they also recognize that they need to continue to build their own capacity to lead and support this work from a district instructional team layer to the level of a school leadership team and through the teacher teams at PLCs. She also said that at the outset of this

school year they would like to transitioning away from the consulting work with InnovateEd through the building of their own capacity. She gave the Board an overview of the scope of work with InnovateEd and also showed them how the District is building their own capacity.

1. Annual Academic Performance Report: CAASPP Results for English 20 Minutes Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics, 2015-2018 (Carey/Ramirez)

Ms. Carey and Dr. Ramirez presented this item. They explained that this report shows four (4) years of data. Ms. Carey said that they are now able to look at this information as being indicative of trends and they see some modest growth as well as some areas of improvement.

2. Executive Summary of the Literacy/Dyslexia Project (Matsuoka) 20 Minutes

Superintendent Matsuoka explained that the shift into Common Core and now to the Smarter Balanced Assessment, has quadrupled the demand on understanding text. The demands on literacy have changed so much for education. He went on to say that we have become a digital world, today in order to access education and the best jobs, you have to be literate. Mr. Matsuoka invited Cheri Rae and Monie de Wit to share some comments with the board and community.

Superintendent Matsuoka expressed his respect and urgency around Dyslexia. He said that there are thousands of kids, he believes that the District is moving into now addressing this topic of Dyslexia, the bill that called it out has been a real support for public education. He went on to say that the process began with this pilot project last year. Mr. Matsuoka invited Dr. Jarice Butterfield and Ms. Claire Krock to give an overview of the project.
