Re: Approval of Provisional Internship Permit (PIP)

Background

The Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) permits Districts to credential teachers using a Provisional Internship Permit (PIP). The PIP allows an employing agency to fill an immediate staffing need by hiring an individual who has not yet met the subject matter competence requirement needed to enter an intern program. Applicants must have a minimum of 18 semester units in the subject area or in the case of the multiple subject, the 18 units is spread across 4 areas. Special Education PIPs can meet either the requirements of the single subject, multiple subject or have served 3 years working with Special Education students. The Board is required to approve the agreement to employ using a Provisional Internship Permit as an action item before the CTC acts at one of their regularly scheduled meetings.

<u>Stephanie Mapes</u> has been hired as a long term substitute teacher at San Marcos High School to cover for a teacher on maternity leave and CFRA (California Family Rights Act) leave. She is currently teaching under a 30 day sub permit but will be in the assignment for longer than 30 days thus the need for the Provisional Internship Permit. Ms Mapes is enrolled in Brandman University to pursue her teaching credential in physics which she anticipates will be completed in June 2019. She has the required math units to qualify for the PIP credential.

<u>James Dalton</u> has been hired as a long term substitute PE teacher at Monroe Elementary and Cleveland Elementary. He is currently teaching under a 60 day career sub permit but will be in the assignment for longer than 60 days thus the need for the Provisional Internship Permit. Mr Dalton is enrolled in Brandman University to pursue his teaching credential in PE which he anticipates will be completed in June 2020. He has the required PE units to qualify for the PIP credential.

<u>Max Silverstein</u> has been hired as a long term substitute science teacher at La Colina Jr. High School. He is currently teaching under a 30 day sub permit but will be in the assignment for longer than 30 days thus the need for the Provisional Internship Permit. He has the required Science units, including atleast 1 in each of the follow: biology, chemistry, physics and geosciences, to qualify for the PIP credential.

Recommendation

Approve as an action item, the above listed Provisional Internship Permit.
