

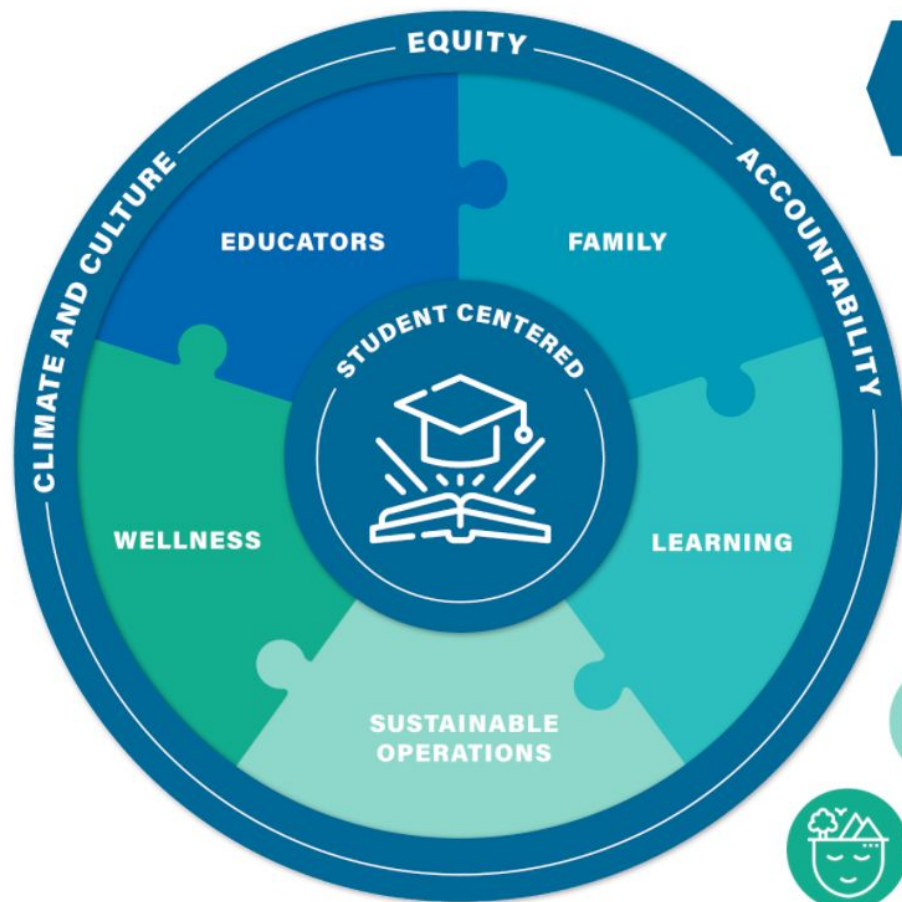

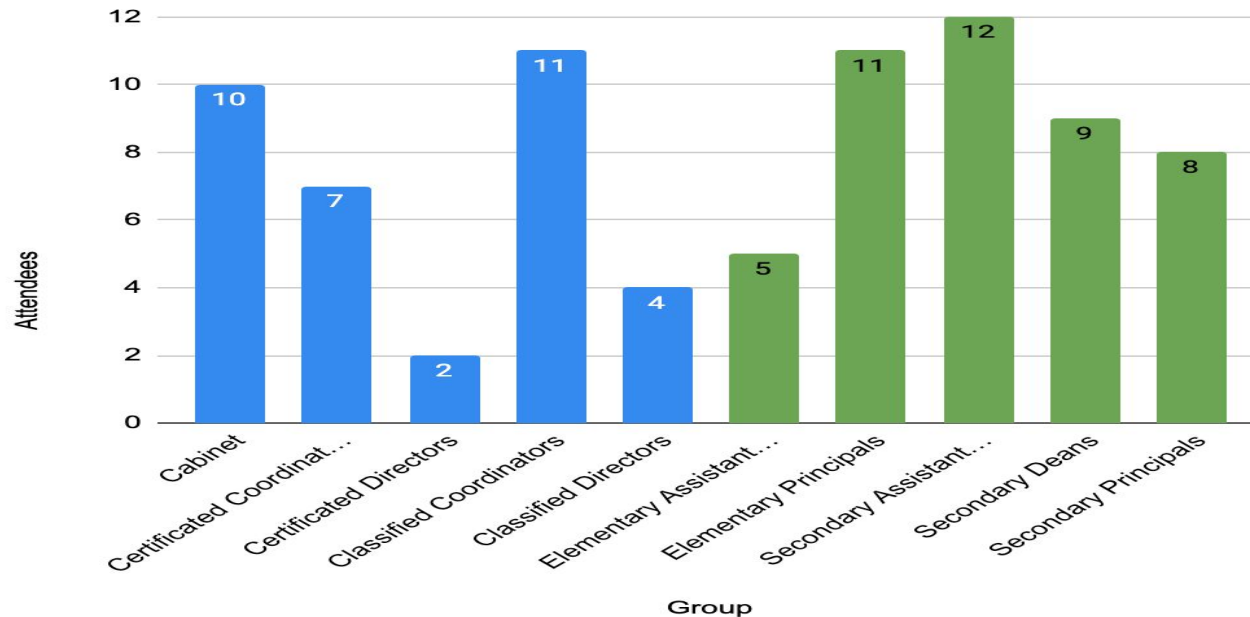

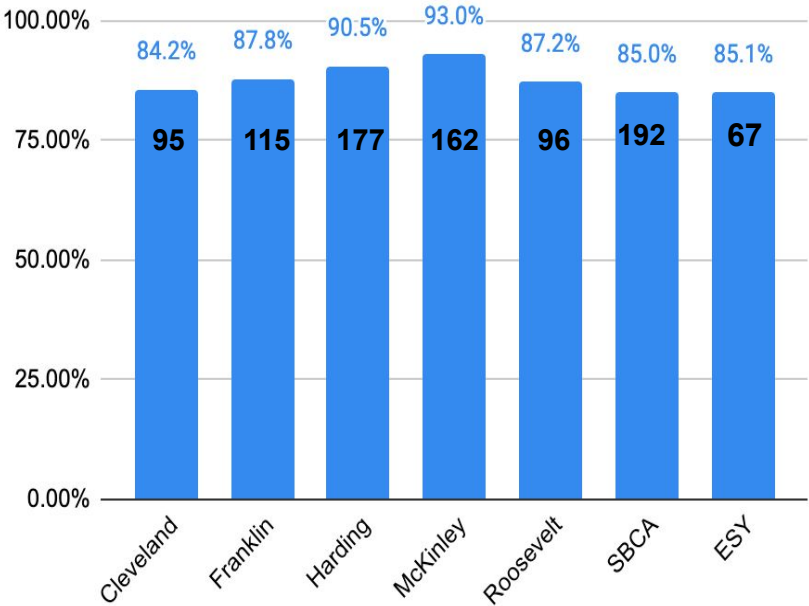

Elementary Summer Attendance Rate

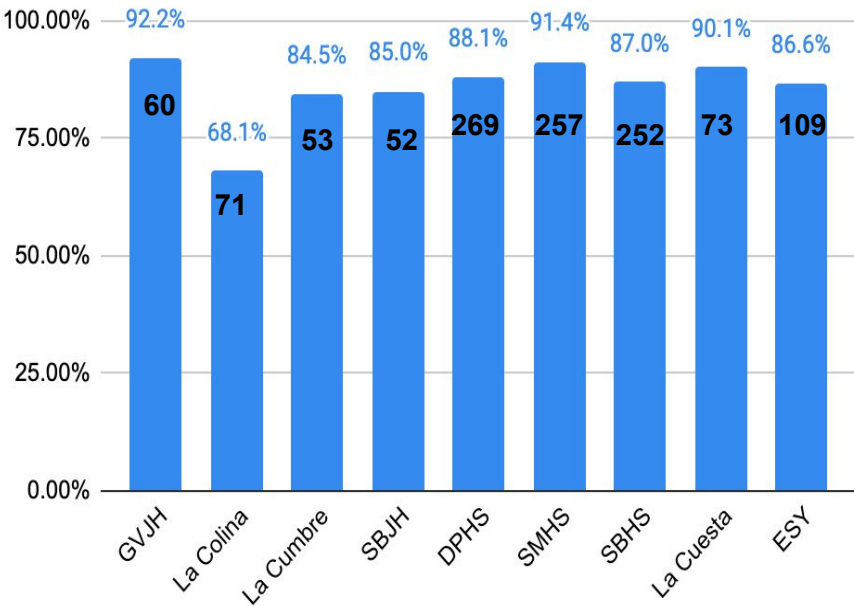
