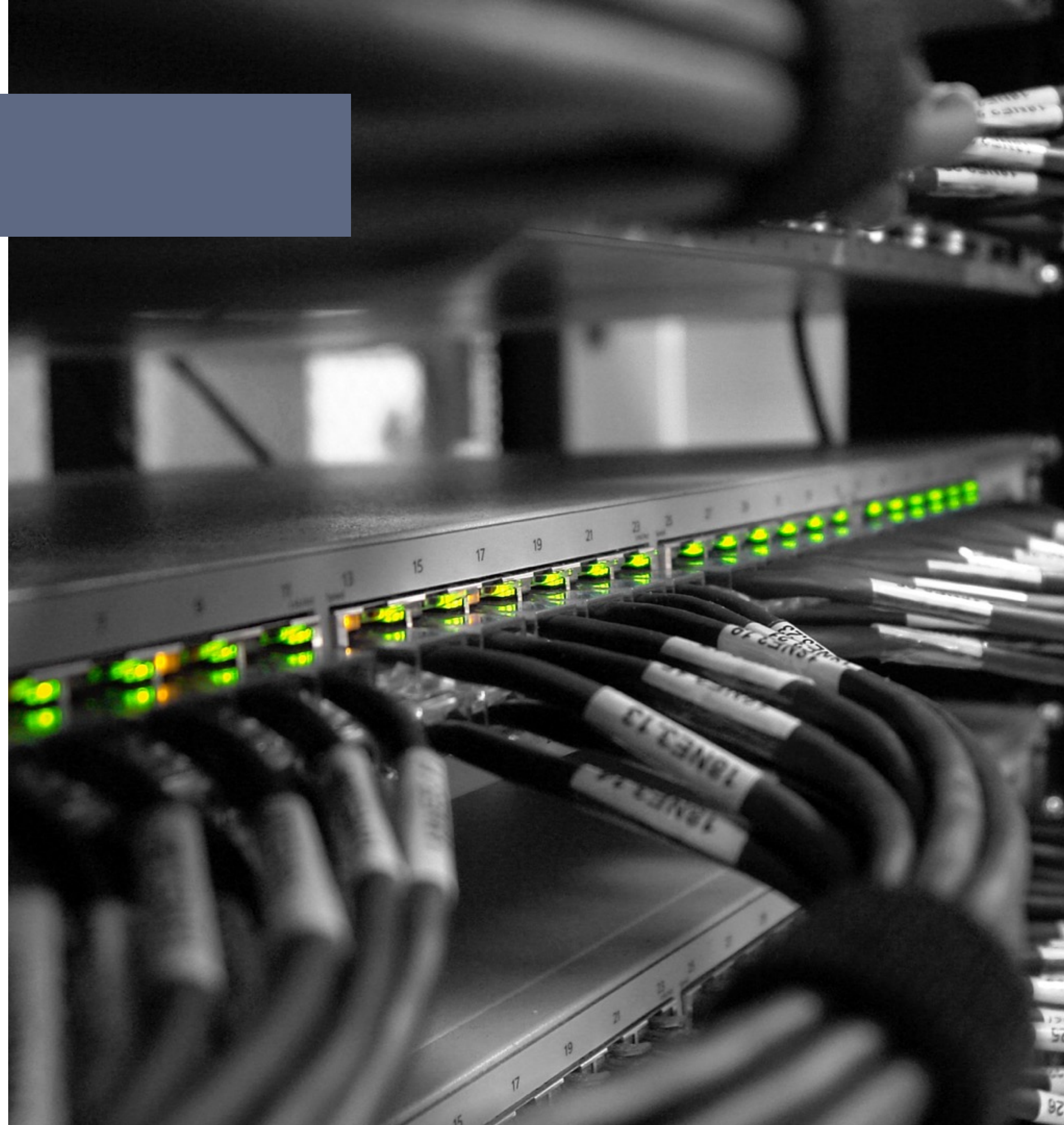

Alan November's Critical Six

1. Did the assignment build capacity for critical thinking on the web?
2. Did the assignment develop new lines of inquiry?
3. Are there opportunities for students to make their thinking visible?
4. Are there opportunities to broaden the perspective of the conversation with authentic audiences from around the world?
5. Is there an opportunity for students to create a contribution (purposeful work)?
6. Does the assignment demo “best in the world” examples of content and skill?

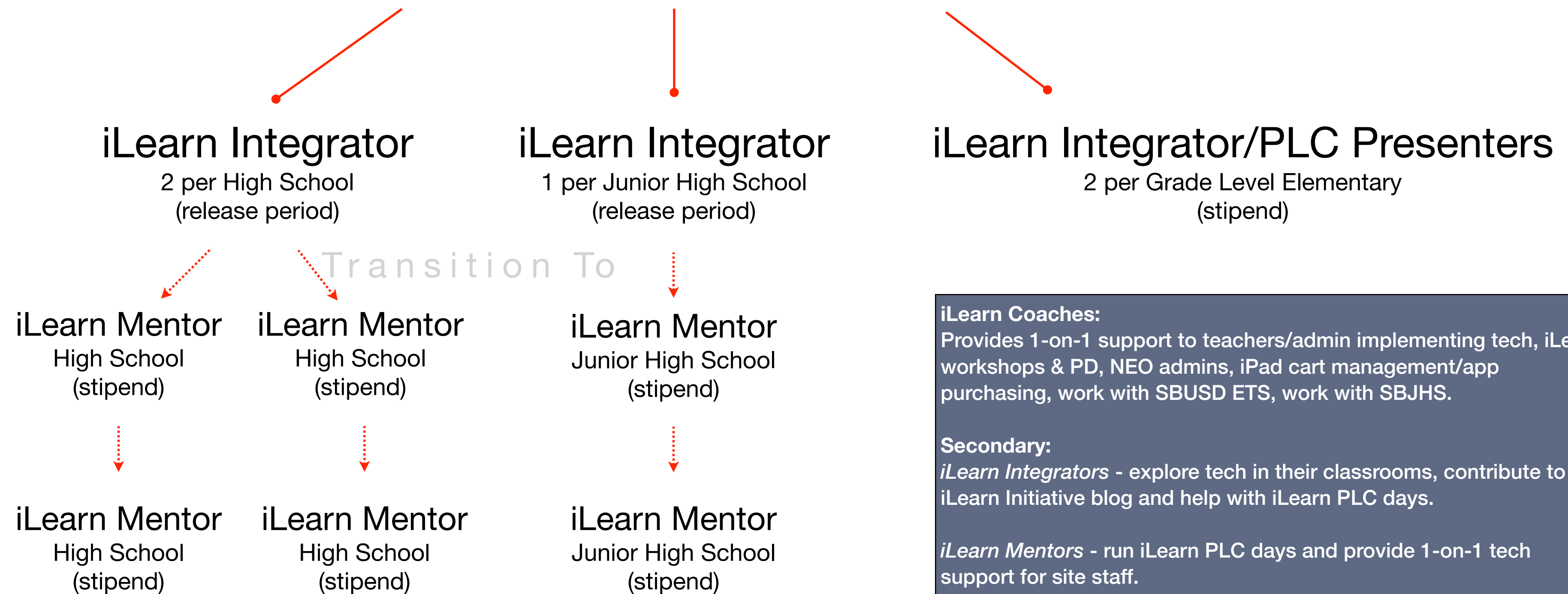

Chromebooks and iPads

While we all agree that Chromebooks have a place in our schools, we believe that our one-to-one device should be an iPad. Chromebooks will continue to be needed where their form factor lends itself to the task a student is trying to accomplish. For instance, a physical keyboard and larger screen is desirable when students need to type papers or do certain types of Internet research or testing. Chromebooks, while necessary, do not force teachers to change their practice. Chromebooks provide little more than a mobile version of our traditional computer labs.

iPads allow us to go beyond what we traditionally do in our classrooms and force teachers to reconsider their practice.
